Landmark meeting

On November 16 2004 the National Nursing and Nursing Education Taskforce (N³ET) convened a meeting that bought together the Australia & New Zealand Council of Chief Nurses and Australian Nursing & Midwifery Council to progress work of importance to the evolution and sustainability of the nursing and midwifery professions.

The meeting specifically focused on three recommendations from the National Review of Nursing Education: Our Duty of Care (2002) Report, namely:

Recommendation 4 – Nationally Consistent Scope of Practice

Recommendation 5 - National Standards for Nurse Practitioners

Recommendation 21 – Enrolled Nurse Competencies

Given that the work of those at the meeting intersects, it was a valuable opportunity to acknowledge the commonalities that exist between the groups whilst respecting the difference in roles, and to affirm a common purpose in progressing the work.

There was agreement about establishing formal processes to coordinate work and a commitment to continue to work together.
